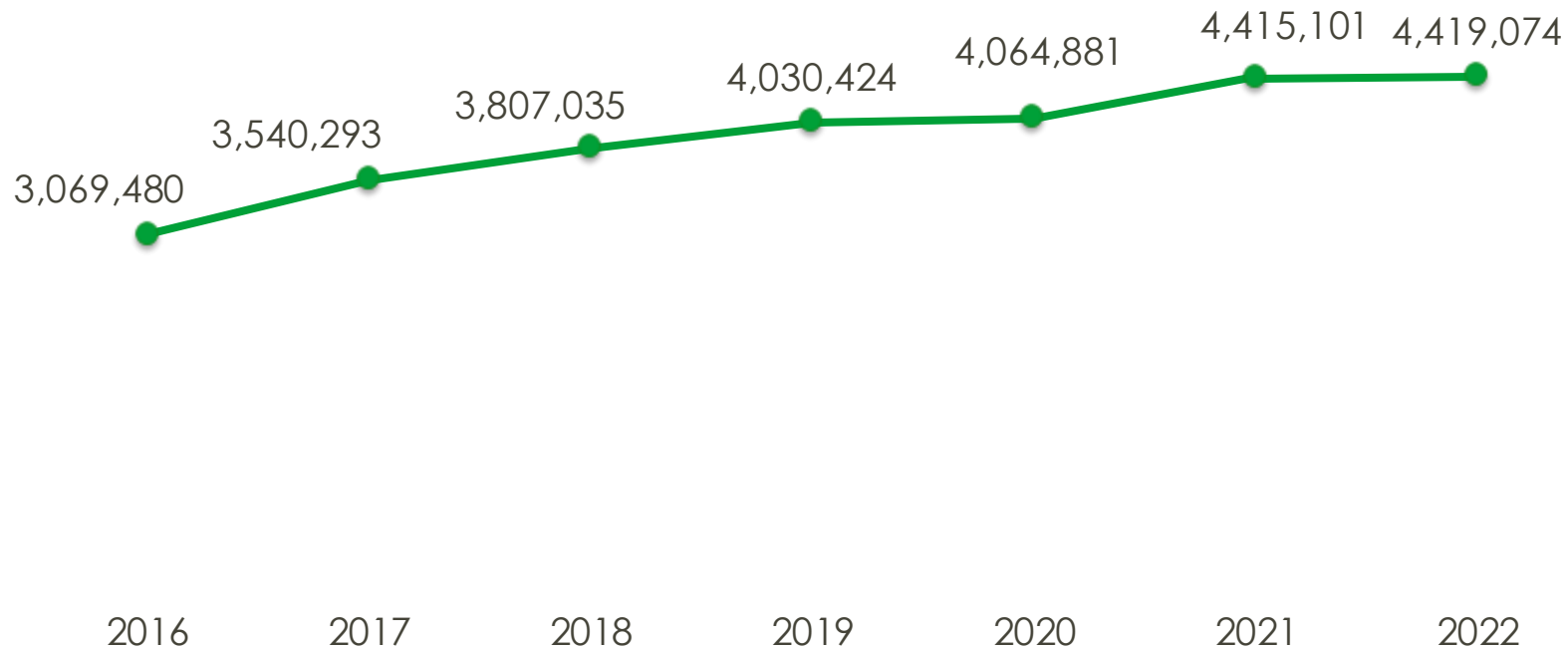

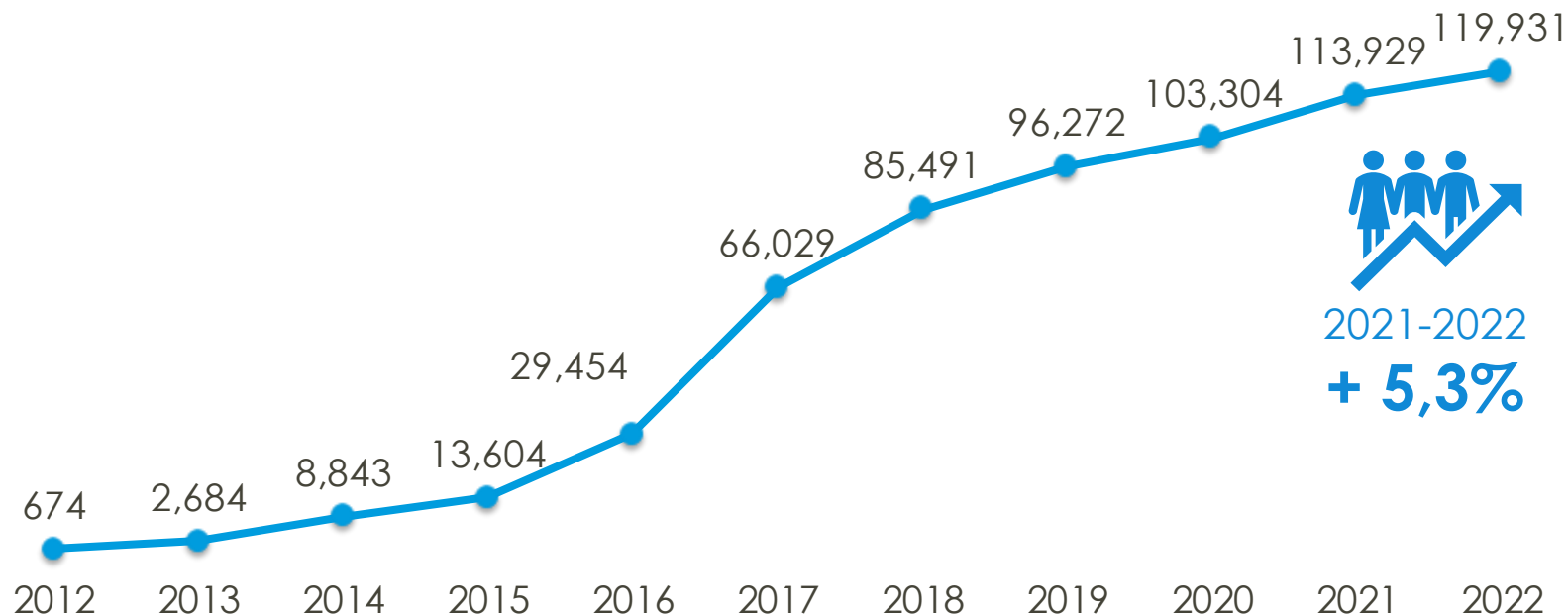
Certified hectares of non-covered and covered crops





GLOBAL G.A.P. RISK ASSESSMENT ON SOCIAL PRACTICES (GRASP)

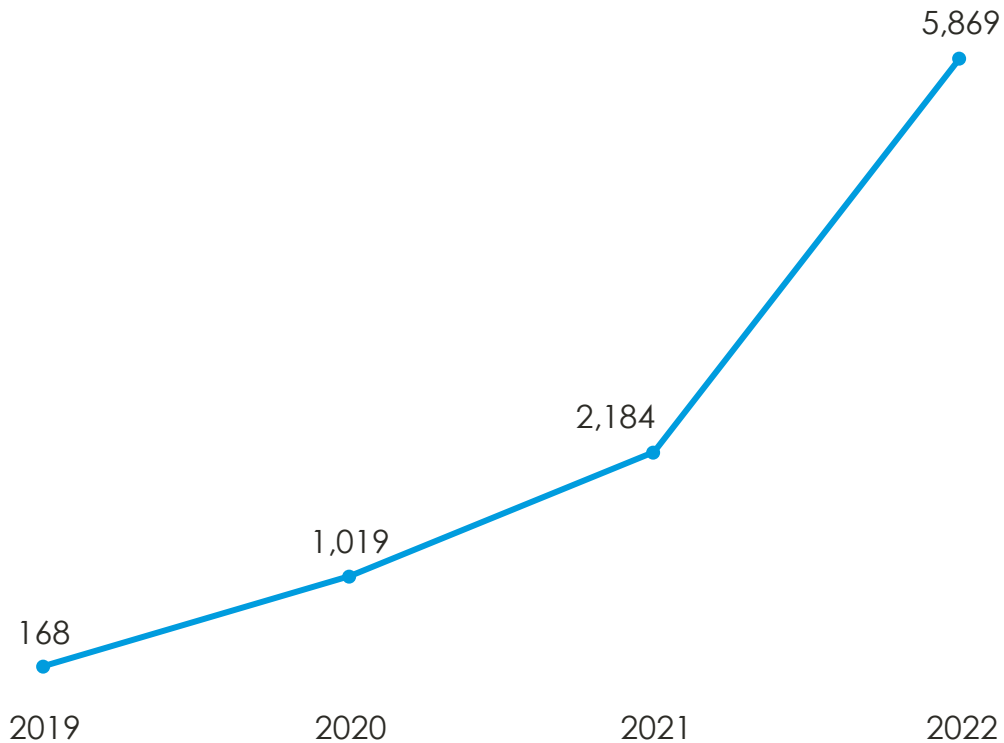
Number of growers assessed

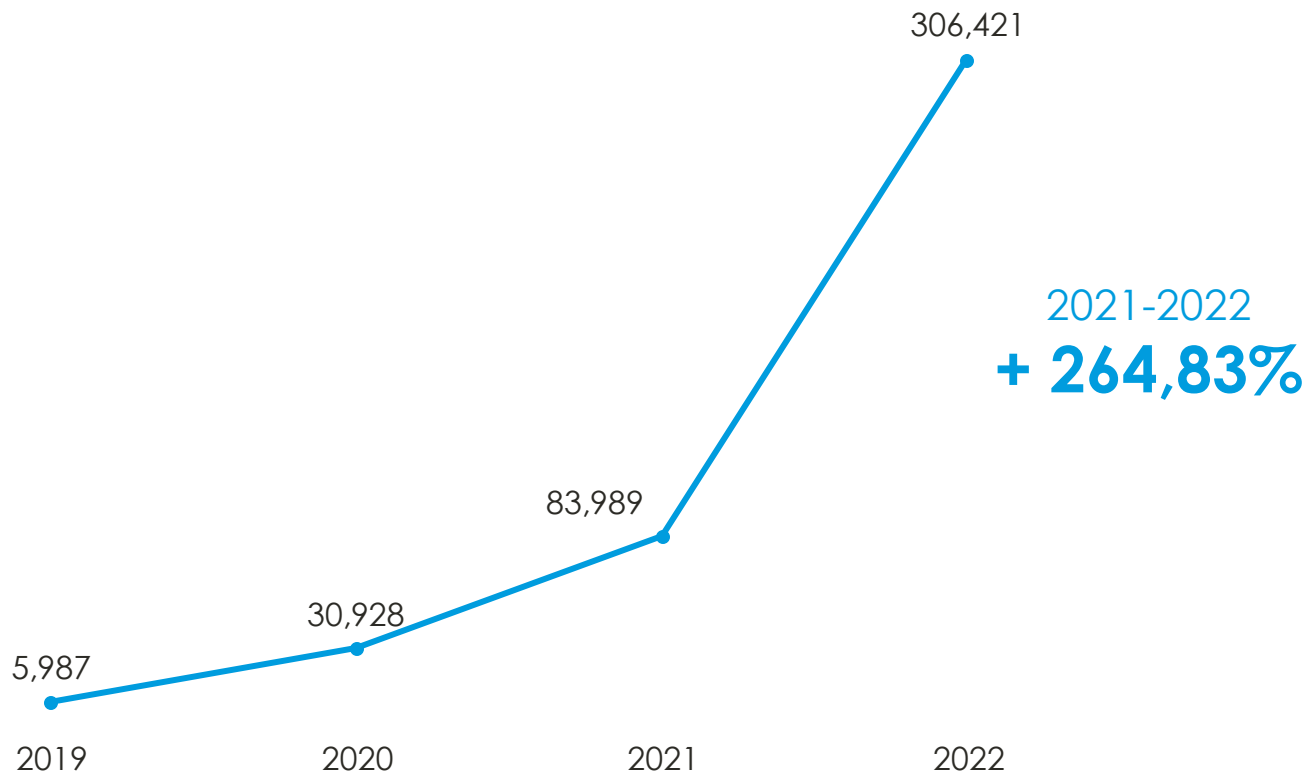

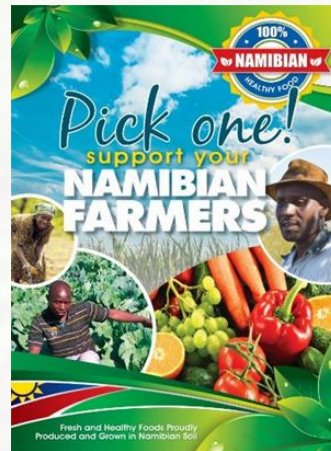

ABOUT NAB



- NAB is a statutory body governed by the Agronomic Industry Act No. 20 of 1992
- Established in 1985
- Goal: promote the agronomic & horticulture industry
- Core mandate: facilitate production, processing, storage and marketing of controlled products in Namibia
- 5-year Integrated Strategic & Business Plan FY2019-2024 develop the agronomy and horticulture industries in Namibia through market facilitation, and ensure a responsive regulatory framework - Namibia Food Control System for agro-horticultural products (**inspection body**)
- Inspection services – clearance of consignments at port of entry / exit, export product inspections, facility inspections & farmassessment
- 86 staff complement
- HQ – Windhoek; 5 satellite offices & manning 9 commercial port of entry / exit
- Funded through levy collection on imports and local products, excluding exports (inspection fees)




- 3 controlled agronomic crops
- 53,000 producers
- net importer of grain – 76%
- 24 active millers & processors



- 87 controlled F&V
- 800 F&V producers
- net importer of fruits – 96%
- 100 active traders

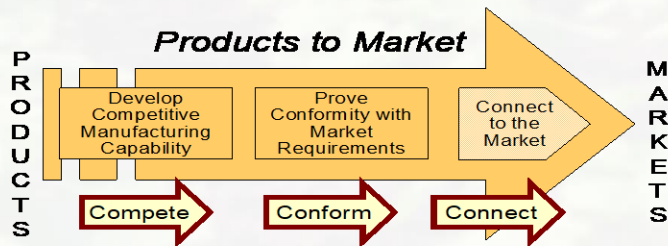
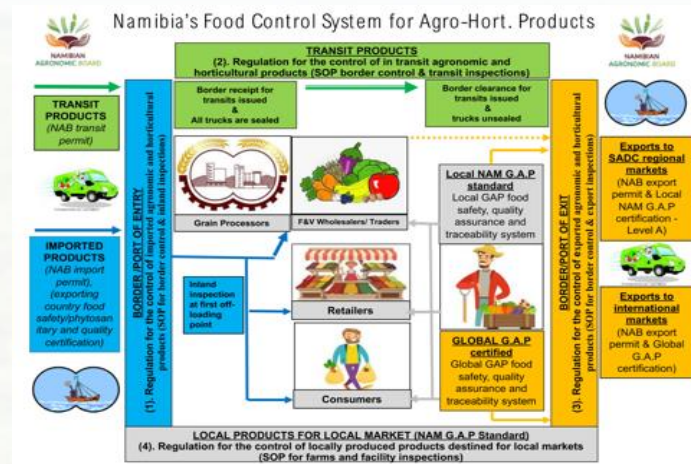

NAMBIAN CONTEXT

- Integration into the Namibia Food Control System for agro-horticultural products (food safety & traceability)
- Adoption of the local g.a.p. PFA standard (entry level), as mandatory standard at farm level
- Enforce compliance to quality and food safety requirements
- Adopt of Good Agricultural Practices
- Food safety risks are addressed = safe product
- Provide confidence to retailers / buyers



... by upgrading supply capacities and standards infrastructures

CONTEXT OF REGIONAL TRADE











- Formalise Mutual Recognition Agreement
- Seek for equivalence and harmonization of requirements (local g.a.p. concept) in the crop sector
- Acceptance of conformity assessment procedures

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COLLECTION OF INFORMATION ACCORDING TO LKSG

Risk Assessment by using GLOBALG.A.P. standards

LkSG is in force since January 2023:

- Applicable to:

Companies with their headquarters and >3,000 employees in Germany (2024 >1,000 employees)

- Requires:

Due Diligence obligations to prevent or minimize human rights or environmental risks

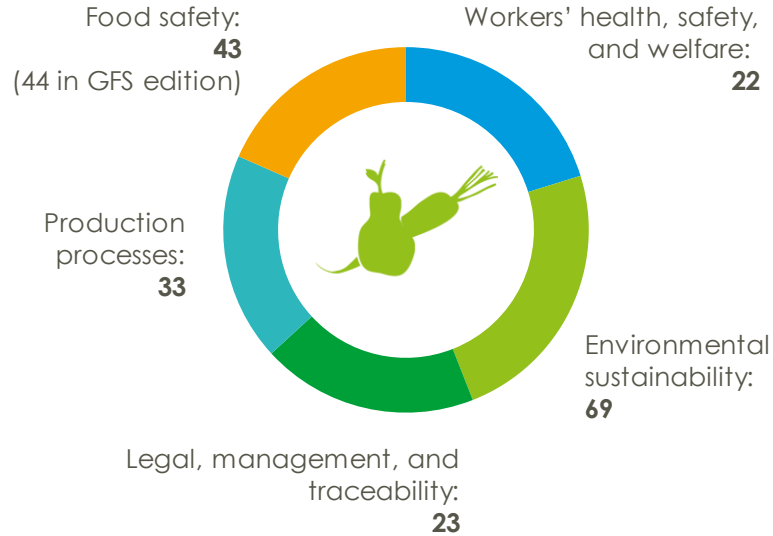

IFA v6 + GRASP v2

IFA v6 for fruit and vegetables: 190 principles and criteria



The IFA standard already contains criteria on **workers' health, safety, and welfare**

The GRASP add-on builds on these with 64 principles and criteria in **four key topics**:

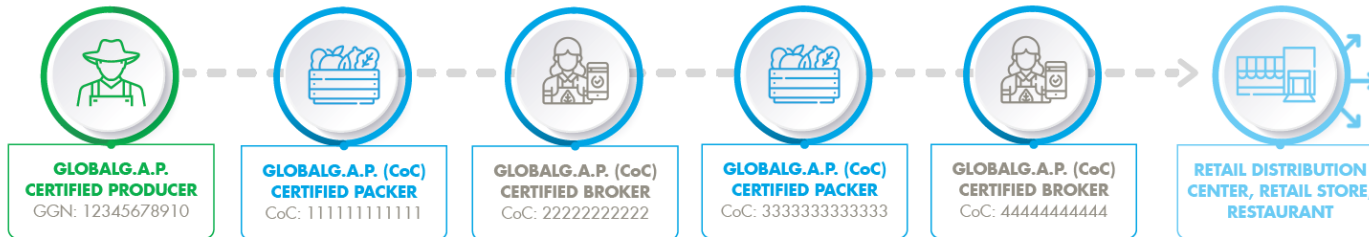
GLOBALG.A.P. CHAIN OF CUSTODY

Protecting the integrity of products

From 1 January 2023, all parties who handle loose, unpacked products originating from GLOBALG.A.P. -certified production processes or make a written claim that a product originates from a GLOBALG.A.P. -certified production process, are required to have valid CoC certification. Therefore, in order to facilitate any investigation after 1 January 2023, all companies shall include the information about the CoC number of their direct suppliers.

Launch of GLOBALG.A.P. Chain of Custody v6.1

- ➔ Simplification / clarification of General Regulations Terminology and Checklist Requirements
- ➔ Extension of certification scope: processed products (cutting, slicing, dicing, freezing, quick freezing) as long as the original product remains visibly recognizable

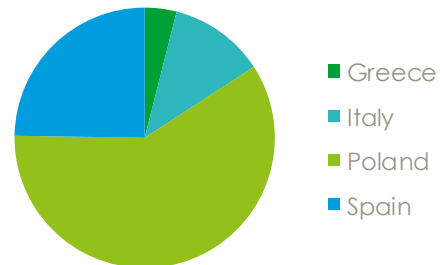

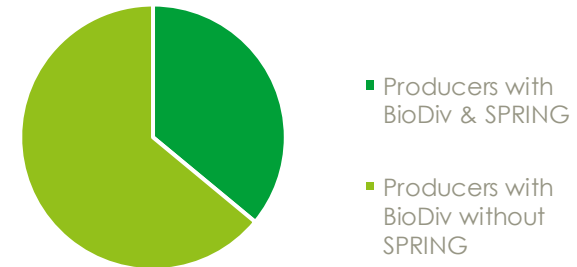
Producer per Option

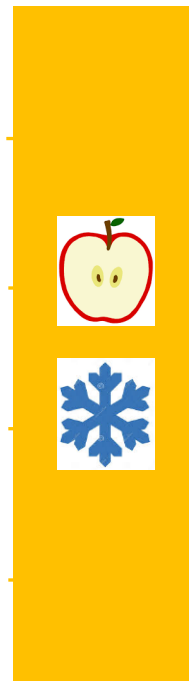
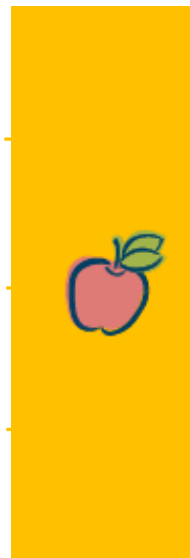

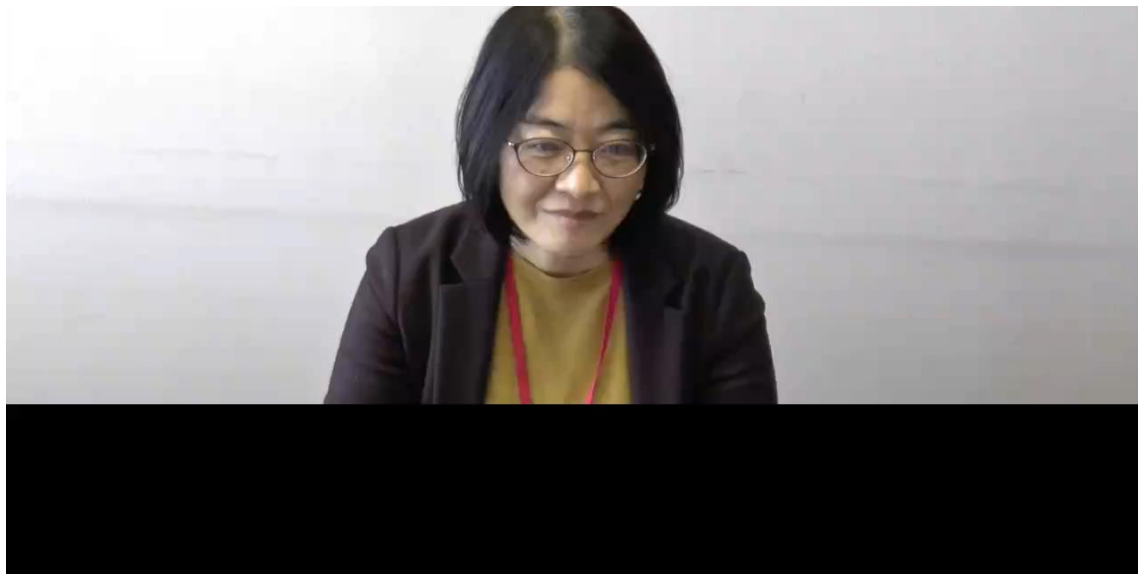
